



Cutaneous Oncology Research Fellowship MGH Cancer Center & Department of Dermatology



The Massachusetts General Hospital Cancer Center and the Department of Dermatology are offering a 1-2 year research fellowship in cutaneous oncology. This position will provide a unique experience in cutaneous oncology and will include roles in clinical investigation and translational research. The fellow will work in one of the premier cutaneous oncology programs in the country, assisting with investigative projects in Merkel cell carcinoma, keratinocyte carcinoma and melanoma. They will collaborate with personnel from the Henri and Belinda Termeer Center for Targeted Therapies, as well as individuals in medical oncology, dermatology, surgical oncology, radiation oncology and pathology. Preference will be given to those who have funding to support their salary as well as applicants who are completing a residency in dermatology or internal medicine and have an interest in an academic career. Applicants who are finishing medical school and are planning on doing an internship year prior to the fellowship are also encouraged to apply for the following year In addition, post-doctoral research fellows with an interest in clinical and translational research and medical students interested in a year of research during medical school will also be considered. Financial support will be commensurate to the applicant's year of training.

The required items to apply are:

- Medical School or Graduate School Transcript
- Two strong letters of recommendation
- Most recent Curriculum Vitae
